

## Concerning the earth

When Eve had gone forth against him, "Dust thou shalt be, and shalt return to dust; for thou hast taken of the tree of life, and hast eaten thereof, and hast given thereof to the woman, and she hath eaten thereof." This was the subject of death, which was the penalty which must be met. Paul's Epistle to the Romans speaks of man in his primitive possession of the tree of life. He says, "Forasmuch as we have seen Jesus 'made a little lower than the angels,' and He has taken upon Himself the curse of death, to redeem man, and bring in that peace-able reign of righteousness upon the earth. As death is the culmination of all the effects of the curse culminating therein, and which with the proffered mercy will be again reversed, and man brought into subjection to man."

#### **6. Why did Paul say Jesus came to earth?**

By a death of shame and suffering, He came, His divinity clothed in the lowest depths of humiliation. No line of demarcation has shown us how much our God can love and restore.
